Joey Anderson, son of Red Sky, received an eagle feather for achieving high scholastic honors (top 10% in state).


Treasurer's Report

Our gaming debt is all paid off! We have one outstanding debt remaining - our legal fees. Once that is paid off, we'll only have our regular operating expenses.

Did you know? It costs an average of over \$1,300 a month to keep our office open. That does not include our operating expenses (paper, printer ink, copier toner, postage, insurance, licenses, bank fees, etc.).

We typically receive a monthly average of \$1,100 in dues to cover <u>all</u> our expenses. Our income (dues) has been dropping off consistently since February. The chart below reflects the actual dues we've received this year.



The Otto Bremer grant helps supplement our income, but those funds are designated for specific purposes. If we do not spend them as designated, we run the risk of losing our funding.

I know many people are feeling the pinch of our economy. Gas prices are higher and everything seems to cost more. It is the same for the Community. We count on you to pay our monthly bills.

I want to thank everyone who supports us. Without you, we wouldn't exist!

Fundraising Committee

We received a check from the Otto Bremer Foundation for year two of our three-year grant with them. The purpose of this grant is to help us create infrastructure to sustain the organization in the areas of tribal membership, personnel, finance, governance, and fundraising.

Our goal is to hire an experienced, full-time Executive Director to oversee and direct the day-to-day operations of the Community and to obtain sufficient funding for our general operating expenses.
