

Bios for Saturday Speakers:

Dr. Caleb Shields, former Chairman and Council Member of the Fort Peck Tribes, is co-author of the book, *The History of the Assiniboine and Sioux Tribes of the Fort Peck Reservation, 1600-2000*. He practices traditional ways and ceremonies.

Leland Spotted Bird is a spiritual leader on the Fort Peck Reservation. In addition to being a leader in traditional ceremonies, Leland mentors his young relatives in learning their language and culture from an early age. Leland is a retired prosecutor in the tribal court system.

Del First is an historian from the Fort Peck Reservation and a fluent speaker of the Dakota language. He has attended and participated in many Dakota language symposiums outside of Minnesota.

Darlene Johnson has worked as a traditional cook since she was trained as a child, often providing foods used in ceremony and for large community events. Darlene works harder and faster than anyone we know.

Helmina Makes Him First is a traditional cook and carries the right to run sweats. She has been teaching the traditional ways for many years. She has traveled and participated in conferences to share traditional values around the country.
