

Other members we need your ancestor's stories too.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

In April 2017 we had our elections. Our next elections are in April 2021.

Perry Altendorfer was removed as historian in October, 2019 for lack of involvement. Thank you for all your time. Greg Standmark is our new historian since October, 2019. Greg has been our historian in the past and he did an excellent job.

Carl Leith will be helping us on federal recognition. Carl is very knowledgeable with the federal recognition process and the Bureau of Federal Acknowledgment. With Greg and Carl we should be able to get closer to federal recognition than ever before: WITH YOUR HELP. We will be sending out information about what we need researched and we will be asking for your help.

NEW HISTORIAN: We are pleased to have Greg Strandmark back as our official tribal historian.

FEDERAL RECOGNITION: We will be re-starting our federal recognition meetings at the office, headed by Greg Strandmark, Carl Leith, John LeClaire and Sharon Lennartson. We need volunteers to help us. We need people to examine documents, writing, go though boxes and organizing.

NEW OFFICE: It's larger than our previous, please call to make an appointment if you'd like to come to the office.

BFA REQUIERMENTS: The Bureau of Federal Acknowledgement is requiring that we have social security numbers listed for our members. We will need to discuss how to add these numbers to existing members applications and documents. As we have not asked for social security number. If you have any input about this, please send us an email or attend the meetings where we will discuss this.

All members of the tribe, even honorary members, are required to pay contributions.

It's very important to pay your contributions. The tribe DEPENDS on these to survive.

We wish to express our gratitude to all the tribal and honorary members who pay their contributions on time or who use the automatic payment system.

These contributions are important for keeping our tribal office running. They pay for things like cultural events, education, powwows, office supplies, programs, gas, inipis, community car, etc.

Please get caught up on your contributions. For those of you who have not paid for a while please get caught up. You don't want to be removed when we are so close to sending in our narrative for federal recognition. If you have not paid in two years you could be removed.

IF SOMEONE IS BEING DISRUPTIVE OR DISRESEPCTFUL, THEY WILL BE ASKED TO LEAVE OR BE REMOVED.

We will be updating the Bylaws and Constitution once again. We have 5 people to work on the new changes. We hope to start in Jan.

We will be changing our Bylaws and Constitution again as some of them are old, obsolete and need to be updated. Once we get federal recognition we may no longer be able to change them.

Thank to Tommy going to a fundraiser and meeting Joise Peters. They discussed our community needing a community center.

That's how the Best Buy thing got started. Sharon called Best Buy and the rest is history. John, Sharon, Tommy came as historian, Victoria Scott came to see what was going on in Now. The CEO of Best Buy Hubert Joly said to call him after the holidays. Sharon, called in Jan, they told her to call in February. There was a meeting set up Sharon, Tommy, and Bobby went to a meeting with Hubert Joly's staff in February. Then Best Buy said they would help the tribe with a grant to help build a community center. Months later Sharon asked for \$10,000 donation for the Pow Wow. Best Buy decided to give us \$10,000 towards the grant writer and fundraiser instead.

We are honored to have our 75th honorary member to join us!

The Pow Wow was great again we had a different display this year, more about the people that lived in Mendota. People really enjoyed all the pictures, videos, etc in the tent. Seeing Red Sky (Jimmy Anderson) on videos or letters that he wrote to protect our culture and our community.

Attendants was a little low but the pow wow was awesome. It was so nice to watch the dancers and hear the drums.

We setup the pow wow in the rain with lots of nice people helping setup. Thank you to all of those wonderful people who helped set up the pow wow in the rain and then on Monday in the extreme heat.

Next year we are thinking about holding the pow wow in August. The weather may be better and also less competition with local events, like the Vikings, Twins, School and the Renaissance Festival, etc.

In 2002, the MMDC membership participated in a comprehensive strategic planning session that resulted in the development of seven (7) long range goals striving to:

- Develop self-sufficiency through in-house business.
