Message from Sharon:

Hello everyone!

I've been working many hours on the gathering.

I was recently in the hospital with double pneumonia. I was also in the heart ward for 4 days. I received a covid-19 test and it came back negative. Then, a month later I got a nasty spider bite that became terribly infected.

Even with these difficulties, I manage to keep going and going, like the energizer bunny. One of the reasons I am able to keep strong is because I have so much love for my people

We applied for the pow wow grant from MRAC and we received it in June 2020.

We did not have our Pow Wow because of the pandemic so we used some of the grant money for the Prayers, Drums and Dance Oyate Gathering at St Peters Church. It was a small gathering, mostly for praying, just getting together. We celebrated our 25th anniversary and we honored Lisa Bellerger, and her daughter Binaishee who sadly passed away Sept 17 after giving birth to a baby boy on Sept 11.

Each year we send letters to government agencies. These are letters to communicate, letters of thanks, requests, grant applications, etc.

We sent a letter to Minnesota Congresswoman Angie Craig and we were very pleased that her office reached out to us right away. We were scheduled to have a meeting to meet with her, however she was called away on business and had to cancel. We did however speak with Nick Coe District Director and Will Mitchell the Legislative Director, about our community, our needs and our future. We hope to be meeting with Amy soon.

Thank you to our Minnesota 2nd District congressional leaders, including Angie Craig, Matt klein, Amy Klobuchar, Tina Smith and Rick Hanson for their efforts to acquire much needed grant money for Minnesota nonprofits, like ours.

Thank you to all of our volunteers who helped with this gathering. You all made it very successful. Thank you to Arvol Looking Horse and Paula, Clyde Bellecourt, Emmett Eastman, Jerry Dearly, and Gary Charwood who was our MC for the gathering.

I was very happy with the amount of people we had at this
