FROM ST. PAUL: Starting on Highway 35E South, go to the MN 13/Sibley Hwy Exit (Exit 102). Turn right onto Sibley Memorial Hwy/MN 13/CR-45. Continue to follow Sibley Memorial Hwy/MN 13 for 1.6 miles and look for the "Dakota Crossing" sign on the right.
